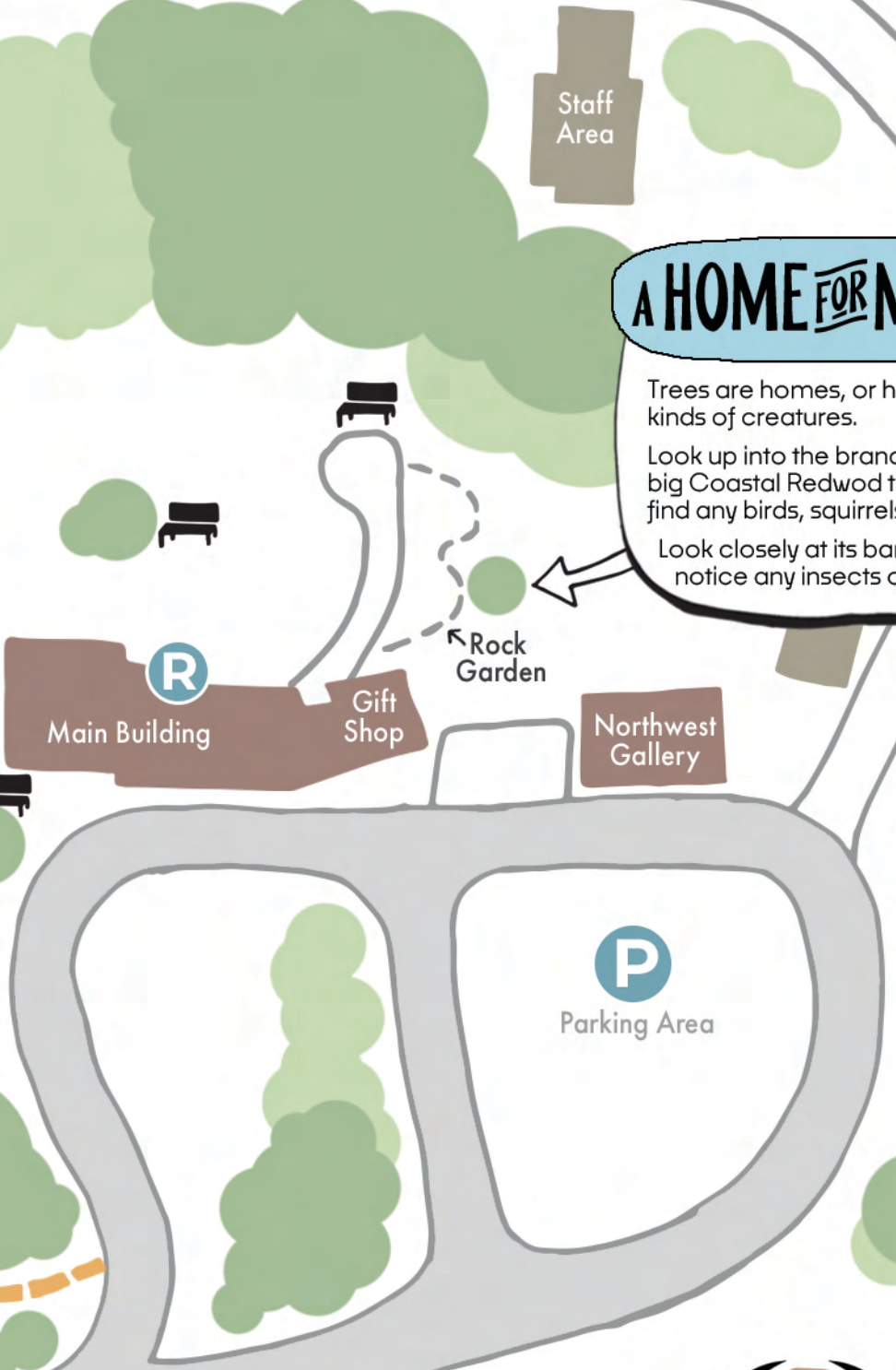
NEW & OLD TREES
